Mustard Seed Community Health announced today **it has been awarded a three-year Community Health Grant** from the Office of Rural Health at the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS).

The Community Health Grant program funds organizations that work to strengthen the safety net through increased levels of collaboration and integration of services. “Mustard Seed patients are receiving regular care at our clinic, and specialist referrals to our excellent partners,” said Mustard Seed Medical Director Dr. Beth Mulberry. “Thanks to this collaborative approach, our patients are making steady progress toward their health goals. We’re grateful for this funding from NCDHHS and the positive community health outcomes it will make possible.”

These grant funds, supported through the North Carolina General Assembly, assure access to primary and preventive care that meets the health needs of vulnerable, underserved, and medically indigent patients.
