

Peacehaven Community Farm was founded in 2007 by Tim & Susan Elliot, and Buck & Cathy Cochran. These two families, raising children with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities (I/DD), envisioned a place that would cultivate community for people of all abilities.

They knew of the "cliff" that so many families face, when their children age out of state and federal programs — yet still seek opportunity, purpose, and belonging.

Thanks to the dedication of these two families (and thousands of supporters over the years), today Peacehaven reaches people of all ages and abilities with programs and resources for anyone who believes in the dignity and perspective of every person.

The full vision for Peacehaven's 89 acres will be realized over the next few years. A multipurpose community center will be followed by residential housing, an arts center, outdoor recreation spaces, a multidisciplinary health care clinic for the I/DD population, and expanded farming operations.

These facilities should serve and appeal to people of every ability; while still addressing the specific needs of those with an I/DD.
